Bring the outdoors in through the use of this elegant, botanical serving bowl design.

## MATERIALS

GBS-12-100-6 12" Square Clear Sheet Glass N-1108-96 Medium Amber Transparent Glass Noodles OC1-121 Light Green Transparent Odd Cuts OC1-125 Dark Green Transparent Odd Cuts PT-540 20.5" PAPYROS Kiln Shelf Paper RO-200-96 White Opalescent Glass Rods S-56-96 Black Glass Stringers SM-576 Wavy Rectangle Server Mold SP-8268 Glas Tac Gel ST-340 1" Running Pliers ST-352 Pistol Grip Glass Cutter ST-356 Tarheel Tools Wheeled Mosaic Cutter

# SUPPLIES

Black Permanent Marker Ruler Toothpick

### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Using a Pistol Grip Glass Cutter and 1" Running Pliers, score and break each 12" glass blank into 12" x 8" bases. Set one base aside.
- 2. On the initial glass base, arrange Medium Amber Noodles vertically across the surface to create stripes. Secure in place with pinpoints of Glas Tac Gel.
- 3. Overlay the vertical stripes with horizontal stripes of Medium Amber Noodles. Secure in place with pinpoints of Glas Tac Gel, then set aside to dry.
- 4. Sketch out a variety of half-leaf shapes onto the Light Green and Dark Green Transparent Odd Cuts with a black permanent marker.
- 5. Score and cut out each half-leaf shape, arrange in place on the second clear glass blank to create whole leaf designs, then secure in place with pinpoints of Glas Tac Gel.
- 6. Use your fingers to break a Black Glass Stringer into smaller pieces. Arrange in place on scattered leaves to accent the project design, then secure in place.
- 7. Nip a White Opalescent Glass Rod into smaller pieces using a Wheeled Mosaic Cutter. Adhere to scattered leaves to further accent the project design.
- 8. Position the leafy glass base over the initial, striped glass base. Position capped project in the kiln on a sheet of kiln shelf paper.
- 9. Full fuse completed project using Spectrum's 6-segment firing schedule.
- 10. Once fired, slump project in the Wavy Rectangle Server Mold.
